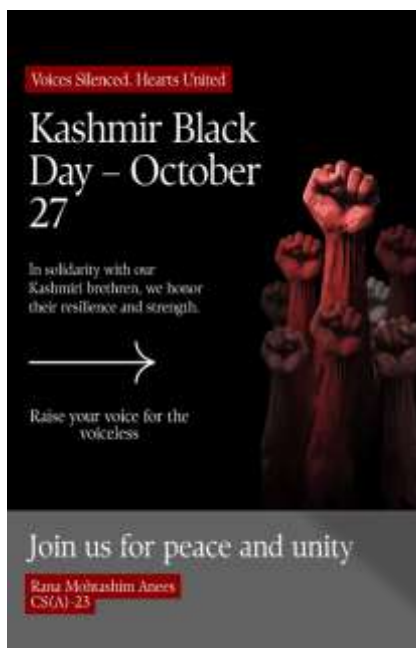

Through awareness campaigns and collaborative activities, participants were encouraged to adopt environmentally responsible behaviors both on campus and in their daily lives.
